

1. Notes on safe disposal of products in Europe

The following contains proposed waste classifications for products from AGRAMKOW Fluid Systems A/S. This includes information about the potential applicability of Directive 2012/19/EU Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) and Directive 2006/66/EC on batteries and accumulators and waste batteries and accumulators. Country-specific requirements must also be complied with.



If you are in any doubt, please coordinate the waste classification together with the responsible waste authority in the relevant EU member state.

1.1 Electrical equipment

Old electrical equipment in the sense of the WEEE Directive normally represents hazardous waste and must not be disposed of with household waste. In accordance with the WEEE Directive, this type of waste requires special disposal.

In case of user sensitive data, it is the owner's responsibility to delete this from the equipment.



All relevant AGRAMKOW equipment are marked with the crossed-out wheeled bin symbol according to the directive, to indicate the content of WEEE.

For cheapest disposal, all WEEE components can easily be removed before disposal by dismantling the electronic mounting plate, and then send for disposal.

1.2 Batteries and accumulators (rechargeable batteries)

The installed or supplied lithium-ion rechargeable batteries, are only intended for industrial use. Possible lamps and batteries that can be swapped by the user must be removed from the device prior to disposal.



The old battery must be properly disposed of in accordance with applicable national and regional guidelines for environmentally friendly disposal.



Lithium-ion batteries/rechargeable batteries/rechargeable battery packs with a damaged housing must not be transported by land or air freight. Special containers are required for this purpose.

The batteries must be handled and recycled in accordance with EU directive 2006/66/EC. Lithium-ion batteries/rechargeable batteries contain substances that must not be allowed to escape into the environment and therefore cannot be disposed of as household waste.

Please return only fully discharged lithium-ion rechargeable battery packs with intact housing and sealed contacts using the original packaging in accordance with the ADR regulations to your locally certified initial treatment plant.
